


Reavis High School Curriculum Snapshot for World History






10-12 Days The content of this unit will include the characteristics of the major early civilizations. The ancient civilizations in Egypt, Mesopotamia, Indus River Valley, and China will all be addressed. In addition to historically significant events, the influence of geography will also be discussed.

Unit 2: Greco-Roman History

18-20 Days This unit will focus on the geographical, political, social, and economic characteristics of Ancient Greece and Ancient Rome. Special attention will be given to the influence both Greece and Rome had on the arts, philosophy, and government.

Unit 3: World Religions

7-8 Days This unit will focus on examining each of the major religions in the world. The basic historical timeline for each religion will be the primary focus. Special attention will be given to judging each religion by its own standards, rather than comparing them against one another.

Unit 6: Absolutism to Revolution

Days

This unit will highlight the important European monarchs that came to power in the 16th - 18th 18-20 Centuries. Additionally, the rise of the Enlightenment and French Revolution will be discussed. Specifically, students will examine how the Enlightenment inspired change throughout this time period.



Unit 7: Imperialism & the Great War

14-16 Days

This unit will focus on the causes of WWI, including the alliance system, imperialism, and nationalism. Attention will be drawn to the unification of Italy and Germany, the colonization of Africa/Asia, trench warfare, the Russian Revolution, and the end of the war. The aftermath of the war will also be addressed.




Unit 8: Totalitarianism & WWII

This unit will focus on the events surrounding WWII. Students will understand the rise of Hitler, the expansion of German & Japanese Empires, appeasement, the brutality of the war, the Holocaust and the legacy of WWII.
